**ORDER GRANTING MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES TRUSTEE FOR
AN ORDER DIRECTING THE APPOINTMENT OF AN EXAMINER**

Upon the motion of the United States Trustee pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 1104(c)(2) for the appointment of an examiner, it is hereby ORDERED that:

1. The United States Trustee is directed to appoint an examiner pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 1104(c)(2), subject to the approval of this Court.
2. The scope of the examiner’s investigation shall be as follows:
 - a) Investigating the sequence of event that led to the Debtor’s shift from making loans to churches and non-profit organizations to making loans to for-profit developers;
 - b) Investigating whether and to what extent the Debtor’s shift from making loans to churches and non-profit organizations to making loans to for-profit developers was motivated

or otherwise characterized by self-dealing on the part of its officers, directors and/or other insiders; and

c) Investigating whether and to what extent purchasers of Debtor's bonds may have causes of action against brokers and others related to sale of the bonds.

3. The Debtor and the Official Committee of Creditors Holding Unsecured Claims (the "Committee") appointed in the case shall cooperate with the examiner in an effort to enable the examiner's investigation to be completed as quickly and expeditiously as possible.

4. In conducting the investigation contemplated by this Order, the examiner shall avoid duplicating the investigation already completed by the Committee and shall take full advantage of discovery previously obtained by the Committee where such discovery is made available to the examiner by the Committee.

5. The examiner shall file with the Court as soon as practicable after his or her appointment an interim report and a budget setting forth all anticipated fees and costs of the examiner, including if appropriate, retaining counsel or other professionals to assist with the examiner's investigation. On notice to the Debtor, the Committee, the United States Trustee, and the examiner, the Court shall thereafter approve a budget for the examiner in such amount as the Court deems necessary and appropriate, provided, however, that the examiner may thereafter seek an order expanding the budget upon notice to the Debtor, the Committee and the United States Trustee.
